

## **AOCS POLICY FOR PUBLICATIONS**

### **FINAL**

- All publications should include “the AOCS Study Group”\* as an author (where possible in early papers this group would be listed in full in an appendix)
- Individual authorship should be determined by contribution\*\* – investigators / collaborators would not be listed unless they had contributed to a particular paper
- All publications (and abstracts) should be sent to the AOCS Management Group for approval before submission
- All publications should include the appropriate statement (see below) regarding ethical approval:
- All publications should include the appropriate paragraph(s) (see below) acknowledging (i) sources of funding and (ii) collaborators

*\*AOCS STUDY GROUP- to be defined (Management and Clinician- See below)*

*\*\* AUTHORSHIP IS DEFINED BY THE AVCC AND NHMRC AS*

- 1) Substantial contributions to conception and design, or acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data*
- 2) Drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content*
- 3) Final approval of the version to be published.*

*Conditions 1, 2, and 3 must all be met. Acquisition of funding, the collection of data, or general supervision of the research group, by themselves, does not justify authorship.*
